regular basis; wood-sheathed wall coverings that will withstand animal use/abuse as well as exposure to water; and an outdoor area for fresh air and room to move. The animal barn is a simple structure – a ground level slab on grade for shelter, grooming, and cleaning; an upper level for hay and other storage, both enclosed by wood framed walls, wood trusses, and vertical rough-sawn siding. The outdoor space was specifically built for animal transport and a composting system.
